Who is a carer?

A carer is anyone who cares <u>unpaid</u> for a friend or family member who due to illness, disability, a mental health condition or an addiction cannot cope without their support.



Caring for someone covers lots of different things, like picking up someone's prescriptions regularly, taking someone to regular appointments, or helping someone to wash, dress, or eat.

Why is it important for my GP surgery to know I am a carer?

All GP surgeries in Cheshire West and Chester record the names of carers. This information helps your surgery to:

- Make sure you receive information about the help and support that is available
- Improve services for you as a carer
- Refer you for a 'Carers Needs Assessment' if you would like one

Help and support your surgery may be able to give you:

- Access to a Carers Information Pack
- Refer you to Cheshire West Carers Support Service and other organisations which support carers and families
- Give you appointment times to fit in with your caring role
- A health check if caring for someone is affecting your health
- A flu jab
